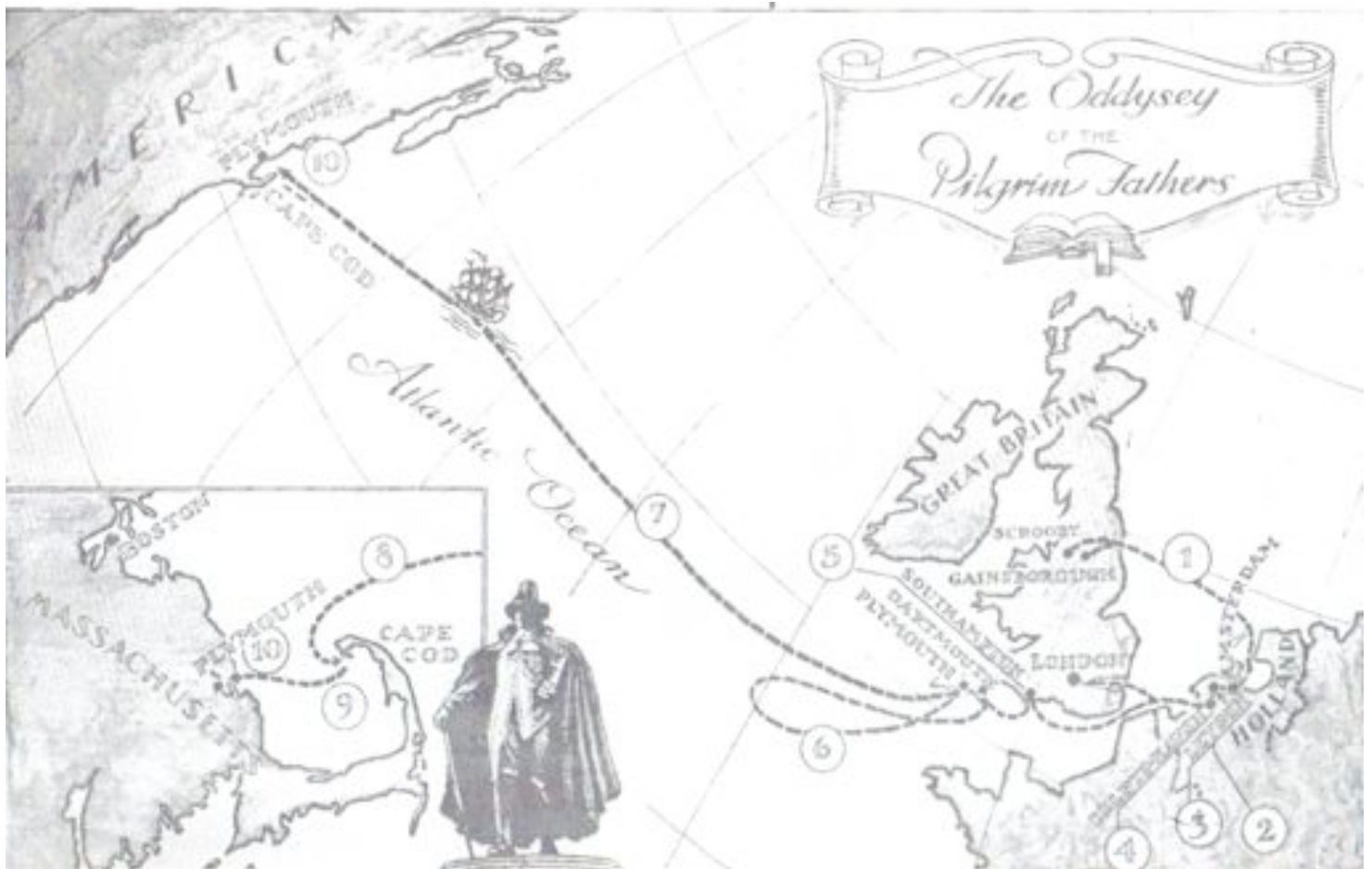

The Oddysey of the Pilgrim Fathers

(1) The Pilgrims had migrated to The Netherlands in 1606-1607. The Pilgrims were living mostly in (2,3) Leiden, The Netherlands. They had permission from King James I of England to go to the colonies because they had persuaded them they were planning to become fishermen. They bought a ship, the Speedwell, to take them from (4) Delfthaven, Netherlands, to (5) Southhampton, England to meet the Mayflower. They intended to use the Speedwell in their trade in fishing. However, the crew they hired to take her across the Atlantic was suspicious. The Speedwell might have been deliberately overloaded when it sailed from The Netherlands to England around July 22, 1620. The crew would gain since they would be paid regardless if the ship went on to the New World. It was declared un-seaworthy and the next two weeks were spent in Southhampton, England, repairing her. On August 4, 1620, the two ships sailed for America. The Speedwell quickly had problems, and they pulled into Dartmouth, England for repairs. (6) The ship was repaired and they again set sail August 12. They again experienced problems and returned to (7) Plymouth, England, for repairs. Each time they stopped meant the crew had to sell food to pay for harbor fees. They decided to leave the Speedwell at Plymouth and the cargo was transferred to the Mayflower along with the Pilgrims who decided to continue the voyage. Some decided to remain in Plymouth when the Mayflower set sail (7) 6 September 1620. (8) Cape Cod was sighted on November 9. The Pilgrims decided to spend the next month and a half exploring Cape Cod, trying to decide where they would finally live. 9) The Compact was signed in the cabin in Provincetown harbor, November 11, because this landing was north of the area (near the Hudson River) that their grant from King James I had given them. In late December they decided on Plymouth. (10) The Mayflower anchored in Plymouth harbor, December 21. They began to build their Plantation.

Answers to the Mayflower Trivia Quiz

1. The voyage took a total of 65 days. The ship left England on September 6, 1620 and arrived at what is now known as Massachusetts on November 9, 1620. (Page 3.)
2. Beer. Before their arrival the passengers had run out of firewood and were reaching the bottoms of their water casks. But of greatest concern was the fact that they were down to their last casks of beer. Due to the notoriously bad quality of drinking water in the seventeenth century England, beer was considered essential to a healthy diet. (Page 3.)
3. The ship's commanding officer and part-owner was Christopher Jones, an experienced sea captain in his 50's. Possibly as a result of suffering the effects of that first desperate winter in Plymouth, Jones would die shortly after his return to Europe in 1622. (Page 24.)
4. Woolens to France, wine back to England. The *Mayflower* was a typical merchant vessel of her day. Records indicate that Christopher Jones had been master of the *Mayflower* for the previous eleven years, sailing back and forth across the Channel with English woolens to France and returning to London with French wine. Wine ships such as the *Mayflower* were known as "sweet ships," since the inevitable spillage of the acidic wine helped to temper the stench of the bilge. (Page 24.)
5. Plymouth. A few passengers were taken aboard in London. The *Mayflower* then sailed to Southampton to meet up with the *Speedwell*, which was the second ship which was supposed to sail to America. However, the *Speedwell* proved to be leaky and needed repairs so both vessels sailed for Dartmouth, a port seventy-five miles south of Southampton. After the repairs were made the ships departed Dartmouth but the *Speedwell* soon sprang another leak and the ships put in at Plymouth, a port about fifty miles west of Dartmouth. The group had no choice but to give up on the *Speedwell*. The *Mayflower* finally set off by itself from Plymouth on September 6, 1620, with what William Bradford called "a prosperous wind." (Page 29)

GSMD Announces \$5000 Scholarship for 2012 Written by Scholarship Committee

The General Society of Mayflower Descendants (GSMD) will once again sponsor one \$5,000 annual scholarship for 2012 to assist deserving direct descendants of GSMD members in acquiring a higher education, with a view to their becoming better prepared for life and citizenship.

In the spirit of the Mayflower settlers seeking to better themselves by moving to a new and uncharted world, special consideration will be given to applicants whose demonstrated commitment to bettering themselves makes them especially likely to benefit from the opportunities this scholarship will make possible for them.

ELIGIBILITY. Scholarship recipient must be a graduating senior; must either be a current member of the GSMD or qualified to become an active member of GSMD and be a direct descendant (child, grandchild, great-grandchild) of a current GSMD member; must provide the information requested for the application; and must enter a four-year college or university or two-year community college.

OTHER SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS. The applicant must submit by mail a complete application packet with all required documentation postmarked by the deadline date. Some parts of the application must also be submitted electronically.

Though not an absolute requirement, recipients of the Mayflower Society Scholarship will most often be in the upper 10 percent of their class and score in the 75% percentile or higher on the SAT or ACT.

DEADLINE: April 30, 2012. The complete application packet must be postmarked by that date. In addition, materials that are to be submitted electronically must also be e-mailed by that date. Incomplete or late submissions will not be considered.

AMOUNT. Upon notification of enrollment in a four-year college or university or a two-year community college, there will be an initial \$2,500 payment to the student's tuition account and a second \$2,500 payment for tuition after successful completion of the first semester and notification of enrollment for the next semester.
