Iowa Mayflower Society members Rebecca Ackerman, Rachel Smith, and Anne Thompson received the Governor General's Commendation Award for their service as Mayflower Indexers. They and the members of other state societies who have been involved in this project have indexed genealogical data from over 14,000 original applications and 1,800 supplemental applications. From this data, the General Society introduced its Easy App Generator last September for State Society Historians to use in preparing new applications, original and supplemental. The indexed data can be used to automatically fill in genealogical information on new applications. A special thanks to all those who have worked on this project.

Treasurer's report

Firstly, the Iowa Society continues to be in good financial shape. Second, we recently completed and passed our security certification for Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard compliance. This is an important yearly certification in accepting on-line renewals and gifts. For us it is not a practically difficult task because we do not actually see any credit card or banking account information. Only our card processor, which is a division of a major bank, sees the account information.

Unrelated to any actually payment deposits, we did have computer problems recording renewals and changes of addresses, mostly in November and December. When I would record someone had renewed, the information would record and then sometime later not show that they had renewed. Is a few cases this was repeated more than once for the same person. At first I thought I had not recorded the renewal, but eventually it became apparent that our master database was no longer saving entries correctly and needed to be repaired. This involved fixing data formats and manually verifying all the renewals entries since July. It simply was very time consuming and had to be done at the very busiest time of the year for treasurer activity and for the other officers who use the database. We apologize for incorrect, duplicate, and delayed renewal notices that some of you received. The database is now working properly and we believe all the entries are correct. There is no connection of the database with our actual banking program or accounts and they were not affected. This was not any kind of security breach or compromise; just an issue with a software application.


